DISCOVERY

Reims. Discover the highlights of Reims. Visit the Notre-Dame Cathedral, which hosted 1,000 years of French coronations. See the Abbey of Saint-Remi and the Palace of Tau.

Taittinger Champagne. Tour the estate of this vaunted Champagne house before a tasting of its famous wines.

Battle of the Somme. Travel through the Somme River valley to the Museum of the Great War in Peronne to learn about Britain's costliest World War I battle. Visit the Somme American Cemetery.

Troyes. Visit this charming, historic city, former capital of the Champagne region. During the Middle Ages, Troyes was one of four Champagne towns that hosted large international fairs. Admire charming timber-framed homes built in the 16th century after a fire destroyed the city.

The Meuse-Argonne and Verdun. Visit the region where 1.2 million U.S. soldiers fought in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive. Pay your respects at memorials for the fallen soldiers from Pennsylvania and Missouri. Visit the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, the largest U.S. cemetery in Europe. Travel to the site of the World War I's longest battle, which spanned 10 months in 1916. Visit the Verdun Memorial at Fleury-devant-Douaumont, a village completely destroyed during the fighting.

Montagne de Reims. Cruise the Marne River through the heart of Champagne Country. See the Montagne de Reims, where grapevines lace the hills. Stroll through the village of Hautvillers, home of the 17th-century monk credited with developing the modern technique of making sparkling wine. Today, his name, Dom Pérignon, is synonymous with Champagne. In Épernay, stroll down the Avenue de Champagne, the address of many renowned Champagne houses. Enjoy a tasting at one of the houses.




ENRICHMENT


